
Celebrate Fire Safety Week Pittsfield Fire Department Josiah Carpenter Library

Pumpkin Crunch Cake

Thanks to our dear and devoted reader Corine Miller, we have several scrumptious Fall recipes coming up. This week we're featuring her idea for a delicious dessert cake that is certain to satisfy your pumpkin cravings! This one is super easy to put together. Be sure to serve it warm with a big dollop of good quality vanilla ice cream or whipped cream. Thank you Corine! Enjoy. MP Christakos

1 can (15 oz) pumpkin puree

1 can (12 oz) evaporated milk

4 eggs

1 & ½ cups sugar

1 tsp cinnamon

14 tsp nutmeg

14 tsp ground ginger

Pinch of ground cloves

1 tsp salt

½ box yellow cake mix

1 cup chopped pecans

1 cup melted butter

Heat oven to 350. Spray a 9 x 13 baking dish with cooking spray.

In a large bowl, beat together the pumpkin, milk, eggs, sugar and spices until well combined. Pour into the prepared baking dish.

Sprinkle the top with half the box of the yellow cake mix. Then sprinkle the top all over with the chopped pecans. Pour the melted butter evenly over the top of the cake.

Bake for 60 to 70 minutes or until the top is lightly browned and the custard is set.

Serve warm with vanilla ice cream or whipped cream.

PMHS Student Spotlight


