Paul Montgomery becomes honored holder of the Boston Post Cane

The strictly honored tradition of presenting The Boston Post Cane originated in 1909 when the Boston Post newspaper decided on an unconventional means of increasing readership. They had approximately 700 walking canes made by a NY company, using expensive ebony wood from the Congo, topped with 14K gold knobs, and carefully hand rubbed finishes which they gave to the selectmen in 700 towns (no cities) throughout New England. The selectmen were asked to identify the oldest man in their respective town and present him with the cane (to be handed along from one honoree to the next) as a means of recognizing advanced age (in the old days, age was treated with respect and a sign of acquired wisdom). In 1930 women were added to the pool of potential recipients. Many of the SEE Cane page 3

Thank you for this great photo by Paulette Chagnon. **Cane** towns which had originally received canes have long since lost track of them, however, Pittsfield's cane is on the wall of the Administrator's office in a locked case. The Town presents replicas of the cane and a certificate to whoever holds the honor of oldest resident, our last being Ruth Huckins, who passed away last year.

On Monday, August 8, the Pittsfield select board had the honor of presenting the Boston Post Cane to Mr. Paul Montgomery of Rolling Green Village. He was born May 4, 1923, in Ohio, and at 99 is Pittsfield's oldest resident. A small ceremony was held at the Rolling Green activity center with many residents attending, Paul's son, daughter, grandson, grand daughter and seven year old great grandson Ryker (who proudly announces he's about to be 8), as well as members of the select board and spouses, all of who enjoyed light refreshments, pleasant conversation and a bit of a trip down Mr. Montgomery's memory lane.

At the age of 18 Paul joined the Navy at the outset of WWII in 1941, and when they learned he was a capable baker (having apprenticed in his teens) he was assigned to cook on a PT (torpedo) boat. He actually cooked for John Kennedy during his time in the South Pacific.

After the War, Paul worked as a mechanic for a number of years, and eventually went to Everett, Mass. where he married his late wife Doris. They relocated to Newton Junction, NH, in 1951 where they raised their children. During this time he worked as a police officer in Newton.

Once the kids were grown, Paul joined the Ministry. In the 1980's {then 60-odd years old) he and Doris climbed on his Harley Davidson motorcycle and toured most of the United States, preaching in small towns where he supported them as an accomplished, self-taught guitar player and all around handyman.

About 2007 the couple decided they should retire and moved into Rolling Green Village in Pittsfield. Doris passed away 10 years ago, leaving Paul and his guitar to continue on. Sharp as a tack, he likes to visit with people and reminisce about a life well lived. Far from over, Paul announced he's aiming to live to be 200. I suppose that's rather optimistic, but he's got a better chance than most of us. The Pittsfield Select Board salutes our oldest resident, 99 year old Paul Montgomery, and we hope he holds the Honor and the Cane for many years to come. *Carl Anderson*

Cook's Corner

We started our grilling series with a trip to Greece, then traveled to South America and now for our last two in the series, we're heading to Asia. The Grilled Asian Chicken Thighs will no doubt become a family favorite. These can also be cooked in the oven; line a large baking sheet with foil, place a rack in the pan, put the chicken on the rack and roast at 425 degrees for 45 minutes. Apologies in advance to those with nut allergies, but the Thai Peanut Ramen is fabulous and pairs nicely with grilled pork as well. Be sure to serve the Cucumber & Red Onion salad nice and cold, it's a wonderful, tangy foil for the grilled meat and the peanut sauced ramen. Enjoy!

Grilled Asian Glazed Chicken Thighs

1/3 cup rice vinegar

14 cup soy sauce

3 TBSP honey

2 TBSP dark sesame oil

1 & ½ TBSP chile garlic paste (such as Sambal Oelek), or use Sriracha

10 cloves garlic, minced

12 bone-in chicken thighs (Danis has the best!), remove the skin

Combine vinegar, soy sauce, honey, sesame oil, chile garlic paste (or Sriracha) and garlic in a bowl and stir to combine. Pour mixture into a container or large Zip Lock bag, add chicken and marinate for at least 1 hour but preferably for 4 to 6 hours (in the fridge). Remove chicken from the marinade. Spray the grill grates with cooking spray and heat the grill to medium high. Grill the chicken for 8 to 10 minutes per side, basting with the marinade along the way. Let chicken stand for 5 to 10 minutes before serving.

Thai Peanut Ramen

3 TBSP creamy peanut butter

2 TBSP soy sauce

1 & ½ TBSP Sriracha

1 TBSP dark sesame oil

1 (9 oz) package ramen noodles, discard spice packet

Chopped peanuts (for garnish)

Chopped scallions (for garnish)

Fresh chopped cilantro (for garnish)

Lime wedges

Whisk the peanut butter, soy sauce, Sriracha and sesame oil in a heat proof bowl.

Cook the noodles according to package directions. Do not use the spice packet. When the noodles are done, <u>reserve 1/3 cup of the cooking water</u>. Then drain the noodles and transfer to the peanut butter mixture. Add the cooking water and toss to coat. Serve the noodleswith the chopped peanuts, scallions, cilantro and lime wedges.

Cucumber & Red Onion Salad

1 cucumber, peeled & sliced

1 red onion, sliced very, very thin

¼ cup coarsely chopped fresh basil leaves

3 TBSP rice vinegar

1 TBSP dark sesame oil

1 & ½ tsp grated fresh ginger (or from the tube, you'll find in produce aisle)

Combine all ingredients together, toss gently to coat the cucumber and onion. Transfer to a bowl, cover and refrigerate until ready to serve.
