Critter Count: It's A Wrap

Full confession: I have lost a full page of notes documenting the Pittsfield, NH 2020 Critter Count. The US Census Bureau would *never* lose data, but I have. What I do know is folks in Pittsfield take care of: honey bees, dogs (rescues, mutts, black labs, pom/papillon, pom/chihuahua, golden retrievers, and a cocker spaniel), cats (maine coon and calico are identified), cattle, goats, chickens, fish, horses, ponies, a unicorn and a monkey. I recall there are rabbits, birds, guinea pigs, and various reptiles - but I did lose that list.

While different from our critter count, the 2020 US Census is in full swing. Have you completed your census form at www.my2020census.gov or by calling 844-330-2020? It's really important to participate because the census determines how federal funding is divided for things like schools and hospitals. And, if you don't complete the online form for your address, then a person will be knocking on your door later in the spring. We're in a tough environment for face to face conversations on our doorsteps; so, please take 10 minutes to fill out your census form. *Leslie Vogt*

Deadline May 1

Dogs must be licensed by May 1st each year under State Law RSA 466:1. Fees : \$9.00 for unaltered dogs; \$6.50 for neutered/spayed dogs; \$2.00 for 1st dog with an owner over 65; \$20.00 for group license of five or more dogs. For all cases, we need a record of the current rabies vaccination. There are three ways to license your dog(s). 1) Call Town Hall and make an appointment with the Town Clerk; 2) Online through the town website: www.pittsfieldnh.gov and 3) By U.S. mail. In the event your dog has passed away or you no longer own your dog, please notify the town clerk by phone: 435-6773 ext 15 or by email: eanthony@pittsfieldnh.gov.
