
Congratulations to the 2021 Class of Pittsfield High School

Cook's Corner

Congratulations to our Pittsfield graduates! We are all very proud of you! This important milestone calls for a celebration. Here are two ideas that are certain to brighten your party table. Both are easy to prepare and can be made in advance. For the Chicken BBQ sliders, you can substitute Cheddar cheese if you prefer; and the Buffalo Chicken Tender "Fries" – you might want to double this recipe (the leftovers are terrific on a salad). Enjoy this special time with your new grad! Bon appetit.

Buffalo Chicken Tender "Fries"

1/3 cup hot sauce, such as Frank's ½ stick butter, melted

1 Tbsp honey

1 lb chicken tenders, sliced in half lengthwise 1/3 cup flour

Vegetable or olive oil

Whisk together hot sauce, butter and honey in a large bowl, set aside.

Toss chicken strips with flour in a large plastic bag, then saute the chicken in hot oil in a skillet, cook until browned, about 2 to 3 minutes per side. Transfer the chicken to the hot sauce mixture, toss to coat. This is a super fun appetizer, served with a really good blue cheese dressing. Or these also make a fun side for Mac & Cheese; or you could top a Big Salad with these bad boys. However you decide to serve these up, they are sure to bring a finger lickin' smile!

Pull-Apart Chicken BBQ Sliders

3 cups shredded rotisserie chicken

1 cup barbeque sauce (use your favorite one)

1 (12 piece) package mini burger buns or mini Hawaiian sweet rolls

12 dill pickle slices, or 12 'bread & butter' pickle slices

2 cups shredded (or finely chopped) Pepper Jack cheese

3 Tbsp melted butter (use real butter)

Heat oven to 350. Line a rimmed baking sheet with parchment paper.

In a medium bowl, stir together the chicken and the BBQ sauce until well coated.

Place bottom half of the rolls on the baking sheet, keep the individual rolls connected. Spoon the chicken mixture on top, spreading evenly across all of the rolls. Top with pickle slices and cheese. Add the top half of the rolls. Brush the tops with the melted butter.

Bake for 12 to 15 minutes until golden brown and cheese has melted. Let stand for 5 minutes. Remove from the pan using the edges of the parchment paper. *MP Christakos*


