

Reminder: The Winter Parking Ban Has Begun

"The Town has a Winter Parking Ban on town roads effective November 15th through April 15th of each year. This ban prohibits parking in or on the town's roads or rights of way between the hours of 10:00pm and 7:00am. The Town has the right to ticket or tow violators. The purpose of this parking ban is to allow the winter or inclement weather maintenance crews unobstructed routes for snow removal and ice control, to maintain the maximum effectiveness of their efforts." - Select Board Winter & Inclement Weather Road Maintenance Policy
