Cooks Corner

Yippee for Whoopie Pies! Many thanks to our friend and **Post** reader, Edith St. George for this fun recipe. These Pumpkin Whoopie Pies

are delectable and a perfect sweet treat for the Halloween season. Enjoy!

Pumpkin Whoopie Pies (Edith St. George)

- 2 cups brown sugar
- 1 cup vegetable oil OR ½ cup each vegetable oil and applesauce
- 1 & ½ cup pumpkin puree
- 2 eggs
- 3 cups all purpose flour
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 1 & ½ tsp cinnamon
- ½ tsp ground ginger
- ½ tsp ground cloves
- 1 tsp vanilla extract

Beat eggs, add oil, vanilla, sugar and pumpkin, mix well. Next add flour and spices and stir well to combine. Drop by tablespoon onto a greased cookie sheet. Bake at 350 for 12 minutes.

For the Filling

- 3 cups confectionary sugar
- ½ cup shortening (Crisco)
- ¼ cup milk
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- ½ jar of marshmallow fluff

Mix all filling ingredients together until well combined and smooth. Once the 'cookies' have cooled, spread some of the filling on the flat side of the cookie and top with another cookie to make the whoopie pies.

Neighbors,

Most are seeking common sense policies that will support our schools, protect women's rights and lower energy costs. Sally Kelly and Jim Allard (let's write him in) are proven democratic and republican moderates to represent these issues for Pittsfield and Chichester. Importantly, the NH republican party has "slow walked" initiatives that would have lowered energy prices.

NHPR reports kilowatt rates per hour are 12 cents in CT, 15-16 cents in MA and 22 cents in NH. Why? It has been republicans who have resisted funding NH Saves (which funds lower and middle households to be more energy efficient), and opposed increasing net metering (which encourages solar implementation). It is the governor who diverted funds from the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative which promotes energy efficiency.

A recent NH Department of Energy study refutes the Governor's claims that solar energy burdens the NH taxpayer. The study concludes costs may rise 1% in the near term, but "At the same time, the study estimated that distributive costs such as solar will be worth roughly one-third the **total price** paid by residential [Eversource] customers." NH has the highest electricity rates in NE and the lowest solar penetration and investment. (NH is 1.2 % while Maine, Vermont and Massachusetts are 5, 17 and 20% respectively.)

NH spends almost 6 billion dollars on out state energy. More locally produced energy is common sense. Republicans may describe democrats as "tax and spend liberals," the more accurate phrase should be "invest and save" policy makers. Vote for moderation and experience - Sally Kelly and Jim Allard. *Bruce Berk, Pittsfield*

Not The New Hampshire Way

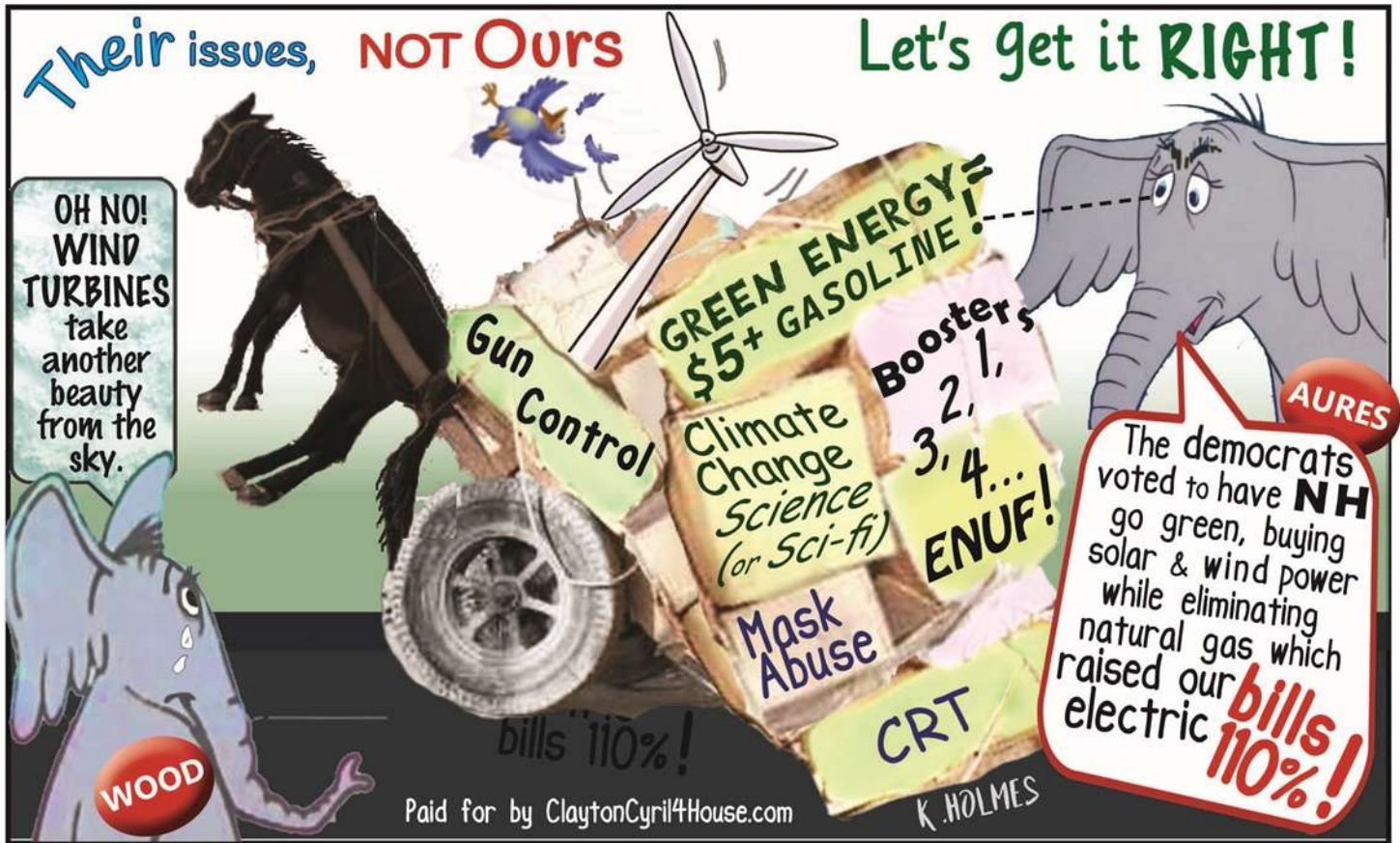

The moderator chosen by the Greater Pittsfield Chamber of Commerce, Scott Brown, had publically declared a strong bias against each of us on a public Facebook forum before the primary election. His words, "The two running against him (Jim Allard) are extreme."

For the last few months we have been actively engaging one on one with members of both political parties as well as independent voters in Pittsfield and Chichester. We have found those conversations to be very informative and productive. People felt free to speak their minds without fear of censure.


