Cook's Corner

Easter is upon us and whether you're planning to do baked ham, roast turkey or lamb, you might be thinking about something different for side dishes this year. You've come to the right place! Here are two lovely sides that are sure to brighten your Easter celebration. Both of these recipes are easy and can be prepared in advance and reheated right before serving. Bon appetit!



Slow Cooker Glazed Carrots

3 lbs carrots, cut diagonally into ¼ inch slices, about 6 cups

¹/₄ cup water 2 tsp kosher or coarse salt

¹/₂ cup sweet orange marmalade

2 Tbsp melted butter

1 tsp fresh sage, finely chopped

¹/₂ tsp Dijon mustard

¹⁄₄ tsp crushed red pepper flakes

Place carrots in a slow cooker bowl, add water and salt. Cover and cook on HIGH for 3 to 4 hours. Transfer carrots to a colander and drain well. Return carrots to slow cooker.

Meanwhile, stir together marmalade, melted butter, sage, Dijon and red pepper flakes in a medium size bowl. Pour marmalade mixture over the carrots. Using a rubber spatula, gently stir the carrots until they are evenly coated with the sauce. Before serving, give the carrots a nice sprinkle of either fresh or dried parsley.



Onion Bread Pudding

1 large sweet onion, cut into ¼ inch slices

2 cups milk

½ tsp salt ¹/₂ tsp dried thyme

1/8 tsp black pepper

2 large eggs, beaten

8 cups French bread, cubed

1 & ¹/₂ cups shredded Swiss cheese

Cooking spray

Heat oven to 425. Heat a large skillet over medium high heat. Add onion slices (keep slices in tact if you can), cook 3 minutes on each side until browned.

Combine milk, salt, thyme, pepper and eggs in a large bowl; stir with a whisk. Add the bread cubes and ¹/₂ cup of the Swiss cheese and stir to combine. Place the bread mixture in an 8 inch square pan that has been coated with cooking spray. Arrange the onion slices on top of the bread mixture. Sprinkle with remaining 1 cup of Swiss cheese and bake in the oven for 25 to 30 minutes until set.

Select Board Review March 23

First meeting since elections, all officers and board/committee appointments were voted to remain the same.

We met with Road Agent Gourley regarding some upcoming work he's looking to get underway. Continental Paving gave us a price 2 years ago for asphalt paving that they have agreed to honor this year, despite increases in their cost. We have roads that need repair, and sidewalk paving will continue this summer in an attempt to make/keep Pittsfield a "walkable" town. Also, we have 3 major culverts which are rotting out, one on Dowboro Road that would cause a huge issue if it failed and we had to close the road. These culverts require engineering which will be getting underway soon.

Land-use change tax assessments, solar exemption request, interest waiver request, and 3 property assessment abatement requests were considered. All were dealt with in accordance with the law and fairness (to both the taxpayer and the taxpaying base as a whole).

We got a tour of Pittsfield's new Emergency Response Mobile Command trailer. Chief Pszonowsky and Deputy Chief Freese brought this addition to the town's safety in case of a disaster by pursuing funding from the US Dept. of Homeland Security for the ENTIRE COST. It contains a broadcast center that can go live from any site on radio channel 1640 AM. Your car radio will let you access this broadcast with or without internet or the power grid.

Pittsfield has many openings on numerous boards and committees. Residents interested in becoming involved should contact the town office for a volunteer form.

We are also actively soliciting ideas for the town-owned vacant lot at 36 Main St. All proposals will be given serious consideration for this high visibility site right in the center of town.


