

Cook's Corner

(SLOW COOKER) It's that wonderful time of year when all of the great

Mixed Berry Compote

berries are in season. Here's a super simple idea for a compote that comes together quickly in your slow cooker. These berries are amazing on top of angel food or pound cake, or on top of ice cream – or just go for it and load your cake with the berries then top it off with ice cream. Why not? Try these on top of pancakes too. Delicious. Enjoy!

Cooking spray

2 cups fresh blueberries

2 cups fresh blackberries

2 cups fresh raspberries

1 cup fresh orange juice

1/2 cup granulated sugar

3 Tbsp cornstarch

6 Tbsp water

1 angel food cake, or pound cake, or good quality vanilla ice cream (or both!)

Coat a 5-quart slow cooker with cooking spray. Combine berries, orange juice and sugar in the cooker. Cover and cook on high for 2 hours. Combine cornstarch and 6 Tbsp of water in a small bowl and stir until smooth. Stir the cornstarch into the berries. Cover and cook on high until the sauce thickens, about 15 minutes. You may want to let this cool to room temperature before serving. Store in the fridge and reheat gently in the microwave, if you'd like. *MP Christakos*
