



Selectboard Meeting March 17, 2020

A home was redeemed by the previous owner for all indebtedness to the town, thus bringing our inventory back to zero.

All board and committee appointments for the Selectboard members remain the same for 2020.

George Batchelder went over the upcoming paving projects. Along with several road jobs, a lot of sidewalk and curb work are on tap, and will be underway very soon.

A generous donation of \$2400 was gratefully accepted for the Harvey A. Marston Memorial Scholarship Fund. This is the first year since 1983 that Harvey and Frannie are together again. They are both sadly missed by this board and the town as a whole.

A much more concise zoning map is being prepared by Cartographic Associates along with the updated tax maps, which will make it much easier for residents to identify where the districts actually are. This is a continuing effort to make zoning easier to comprehend for those who don't have to deal with it every day. Once the case law is removed from the ordinance as voted on the 10th, it will make an easier read. None of these efforts relax the ordinance- they just make it easier to comprehend. *Carl Anderson*

The 568 members of this community who cast ballots during the municipal elections two weeks ago did a great good service to our town. They exercised the most sacred of our rights and the most profound of our responsibilities when they marked their choices for who should fill local offices and which warrant articles should be enacted or discarded. By any measure, 568 total votes is disappointing. Pittsfield has about four times that number of registered voters. We all should expect better participation. However, those who did turn out or sent in an absentee ballot should be commended as they determined the near-term direction our town will head. Speaking as a member of the Select Board, I want to thank the voters for the confidence and trust they placed in the recommendations of both the Select Board and the Budget Committee. All of Pittsfield's boards and committees work hard to do the best possible job for the town, but the Budget Committee is owed some

special recognition. Theirs is a huge task and they do it well. Pittsfield is on a better path. A lot of work remains, but good things are happening and everyone who voted helped chart that path. J. C. Allard

Cook's Corner One Pot Pasta



This is a family favorite. Simple, fresh, elegant, and it goes with everything. You can eat a bowl of this by itself, or it's terrific alongside grilled chicken or fish, or pan-sauteed chicken piccata (with lemon & capers). We've also added a pound of

(raw, peeled) shrimp to the pan, for the last 2 or 3 minutes. You could certainly add mussels, clams, scallops if desired. Pretend you're on the Amalfi Coast. Why not? MANGIA!

Recipe

12 oz linguine (dried)

12 oz cherry or grape tomatoes, halved

- 1 onion, thinly sliced (about 2 cups)
- 4 cloves of garlic, thinly sliced

¹/₂ tsp red pepper flakes (or more / less, to taste)

- 2 sprigs of fresh basil leaves, or about 4 large leaves
- 2 Tbsp olive oil
- Salt & fresh ground pepper
- 4 and ½ cups water

Combine all ingredients in a large, straight-sided skillet. Start with the water and olive oil, then add pasta (broken in half) and everything else. I usually arrange the pasta, tomatoes, onion, garlic and basil leaves into 'quadrants' on top of the water / oil.

Bring the pan to a boil and simmer, stirring with tongs, until pasta is *al dente* and the liquid has been absorbed. Usually takes about 9 or 10 minutes.

Serve with fresh grated Parmesan cheese, a nice salad, great music and a glass of red or white. Heaven. Don't forget crusty bread for scooping & dipping. In the summer, especially when we serve with grilled fish (or if we add shrimp), squeeze a little fresh lemon across the pan before serving. It brightens the flavors.
