Spotlight on The Pittsfield Youth Workshop

The Pittsfield Youth Workshop (PYW) was founded in 1986 by a group of parents who saw the need for a safe and constructive place for young people. In 1987, this group incorporated the PYW as a 501(c) (3) non-profit, initially meeting in various locations around town. It took close to 12 years before the program began to flourish and they were able to rent dedicated space.

More than 35 years later, the PYW is a cherished, highly successful and well established institution. The center is open year round, providing after-school activities for children grades 6 through 12. In summer they operate daily from 2:00 pm to 6:00 pm. PYW is unique within the State in that it's free (donations are welcome). There are only 4 other 'no-fee' based youth centers in New Hampshire, all of the others are operated either by local towns or law enforcement agencies. PYW does not receive any funding from the Town of Pittsfield, or taxpayers.

Zach Powers, Executive Director of the PYW, joined the organization in 2004. He completed his Bachelors and Masters degrees at UNH, specializing in education and specifically 'experiential and environmental' learning. Zach has always been more interested in education that occurs outside of the traditional classroom setting. Although he had no experience in the non-profit realm, he says, "I fell in love with the town of Pittsfield, and the kids are amazing." PYW staff also include Laurie Sweeney, full-time Program Director, who worked in the Northwood school district for 16 years; and Hannah Morin, part-time Program Assistant, who is a graduate student, pursuing a Masters degree.





In 2007 PYW moved into the former Pittsfield Academy building on Park Street (Masonic Hall / Corinthian Lodge), where they have created a warm and inviting space for young people to meet, learn new skills, participate in a range of arts and crafts and cook. PYW is a 'drop in' center, meaning kids can come and go. The number of youth who join varies but the center averages about 15 kids per day. One of their leadership development activities is the PYW "store", where the kids run a small shop and they are exposed to a variety of small business skills, including planning and ordering inventory, setting prices, deciding what products to 'sell', etc.

Other activities include filling orders of special holiday themed gifts for the local Meals on Wheels program and working on a mural with the Library for Old Home Day. In the summer months on Tuesdays and Thursdays there are field trips which take the kids around the region for fun adventures such as canoeing at Drake Field, laser tag, disc golf, indoor rock climbing. Over the years PYW has gone on trips to The Flume, the Seacoast Science Center and the Squam Lake Science Center. But Zach shared, "sometimes the kids just want to hang out at the center, play board games, use the bank of computers, read and just spend time with their friends, and that's fine too."

After 35 years, there are now former participants who graduated from the program bringing their children to PYW. One of the most common things that Zach and team hear is that PYW is a safe, secure and **See PYW on page 3**

The organization relies exclusively on donations and grants. In May 2022, under Zach's guidance, they participated in the New Hampshire Gives online charity event. The Foss Family Foundation offered to use their annual donation to match up to \$40,000 during the fund-raising event and PYW ultimately raised \$37,000. Cook's Corner Portobello Burgers and Blue Cheese Cole Slaw

There's nothing quite like a juicy burger, cooked on the grill, on a warm summer evening. I agree, but here's a healthier option that's quick and easy to make. You'll be surprised at how 'meaty' these mushroom caps taste. Serve them just as you would your regular beef burger. We like to put these on toasted brioche rolls with cheese, lettuce, tomato and onion. We also often serve these 'open face'on toasted English Muffins (the jumbo size), with a schmear of Dijon mustard and mayo and topped with sauteed onions and Swiss cheese.

Be sure to make either roasted potatoes or oven fries and to round out this meal, make a batch of this delicious Blue Cheese Cole Slaw. Bon appetit! *MP Christakos*

Portobello Mushroom Burgers

2 to 4 portobello mushrooms, the large ones, stems discarded and scrape out some of the gills if desired



Olive oil Salt & pepper Heat oven to 425.

Brush both sides of the mushrooms with a little olive oil and season with salt and pepper. Place mushroom caps, stem side down, on a rimmed baking sheet covered with foil. Roast the mushrooms in the oven for 10 minutes, until tender.

Blue Cheese Cole Slaw

1 (16 oz) bag of shredded cole slaw mix (save the sauce packet for another use)

1 cup mayonnaise

1/2 to 3/4 cup crumbled blue cheese

- 2 TBSP lemon juice
- 1 tsp black pepper
- 1 tsp sugar


Place cole slaw mix in a large bowl and toss to separate. In a medium bowl, mix together the remaining ingredients. Pour the dressing over the slaw and toss well to combine. Let it rest for 5 minutes, then toss one more time. Refrigerate for 2 hours before serving.
