#### **School Board Update**

The Board only met once in December, but were able to accomplish the important work of reviewing and approving the proposed 2024-2025 budget so that it can move along to the Budget Committee for review.

At our meeting on the 7th, we were once again pleased to hear from the building-level administration all about the happenings at PES and PMHS. PES Principal Kristen White shared all the ways PES celebrated World Kindness Day, updated the Board on reading progress for Title I, and gave a thorough report of behavior management within the building.

PMHS Principal Derek Hamilton brought forward, and the Board approved, the Class of 2024 Senior Trip request. Additionally, Mr. Hamilton shared the good news that Pittsfield Middle High School successfully met the requirements to exit Comprehension Support and Improvement Status. PHS was 1 of only 11 schools that was able to accomplish this.

In addition to budget and policy review, Mr. Lane shared information about the most recent findings in the lawsuit surrounding fair funding for New Hampshire schools. The Board intends to continue working on and advocating for this issue.

The Board would like to wish all of the students, faculty and staff of Pittsfield School District a very happy holiday season. We will see you in the new year!

# Cook's Corner Beef & Sausage Pasta Bake

Happy New Year, dear friends! Whelp....it's January. We're bound to get snow at some point soon. Here's the perfect dish for the perfect snow day.

After you're done sledding (or shoveling, or both), pop in the kitchen and you can pull this dish of deliciousness together quickly. Put on your favorite tunes, or grab that movie you've been wanting to see. Warm up some crusty rolls or garlic bread, cut a nice salad and ring the dinner bell. Make someone else do the dishes. Enjoy! MP Christakos

1 lb ground beef

1 lb bulk Italian sausage

2 cans petite diced tomatoes (or 3 cans, if you prefer things a little saucier)

2 TBSP tomato paste

1 tsp dried oregano

1 tsp dried basil

1 tsp red pepper flakes (or more to taste)

Salt & pepper to taste

1 bag dried egg noodles

8 oz cream cheese, softened.

8 oz sour cream

1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese

1 cup shredded Mozzarella cheese

1 cup grated Parmesan cheese

Heat oven to 350.

Brown the ground beef and sausage in a large pot or skillet until no longer pink. Drain the meat, return to the pot and add the petite diced tomatoes and tomato paste. Season with the oregano, basil, red pepper flakes and salt & pepper.

Meanwhile, cook the egg noodles according to package directions. When done, drain and return to pot. Add the cream cheese and sour cream to the hot noodles and stir, gently, to combine.

Lightly grease a 13 x 9 baking pan with cooking spray. Add the cooked noodles to the pan. Then top with the meat mixture. Top the meat mixture with the 3 cheeses.

Bake for 30 to 40 minutes, until heated through and bubbly on the sides.

#### Jessica's Law

Jessica's Law in New Hampshire requires motorists to remove snow and ice from their vehicles. That law is RSA 265:79-b:

Negligent Driving, sometimes called "Jessica's Law." "The manner that endangers or is likely to endanger any person or property shall be guilty of a violation and shall be fined not less than \$250 nor more than \$500 for a first offense and not less than \$500 nor more than \$1,000 for a second or subsequent offense." The basis of the law was a tragic accident that claimed the life of Jessica Smith in 1999


Jessica's Law was passed by the New Hampshire legislature in 2001 (and later amended in 2005) in response to the death of Jessica Smith, a 20 year old woman who was killed when ice flew off the top of a truck and hit a second truck, resulting in a head-on collision with Jessica's car.

Please look out for one another this winter season and clear your car off.
