As you meander your way through town, you can't miss the big project going on at Bell Brothers Gas Station, located at the prominent 4 corners in Pittsfield. What is going on? Well, the underground fuel tanks and gas pumps are being replaced, allowing for needed updates and diesel fuel. No more having to go out of town to get diesel!

The planning for this began many months ago and is expected to be completed in early December. The convenience store, hair salon, and laundromat remain open for business - and the store is now offering 'grab and go' food items!

A little history: What's in a name? Back in 1986, Bob Chagnon and a partner bought the building, which at the time was Webber's Restaurant. Before Webber's, the building housed Pelissier's Garage, and then Freese Brothers Garage. Under Bob's ownership, the restaurant continued to be a meeting place for the locals who then affectionately called Bob and his partner 'Ding and Dong' - yup, that is how the "Bell Brothers" name came to be! Over time, the convenience store and gas pumps replaced Webber's. You can still find locals sitting 'out back' in the store, solving all the world's problems!

During the early years, Bob's son Joel became familiar with the business while he ran around being a kid, learning a few of the ropes and coming back to town and the business after college. Cook's Corner Fluffy Baked Potatoes and Roasted Sausage with Sweet Potatoes & Grapes

Thanksgiving is about two weeks away, and I'm sure we're all starting to plan for the feast. Whether you do a turkey, chicken, or ham, Thanksgiving is really all about the sides, right? Here are two I think you'll enjoy throughout the year, but they will definitely be a hit on T-Day. If you love mashed potatoes, the Fluffy Baked Mashed Potatoes will take you straight to Heaven. The Roasted Sausage with Sweet Potatoes & Grapes could easily be a main dish, served with a salad on the side. Bon appetit!

Oven Roasted Sausage with Sweet Potatoes & Grapes

3 to 4 lbs sweet potatoes, peeled and cut into 1 inch cubes (about 6 medium potatoes or 3 large ones) 1 (lb.) package sweet Italian chicken sausage links, each link cut in half lengthwise then into 1 inch slices

1 bunch of seedless grapes, green, red or a mix

½ to 1 cup of good quality balsamic vinaigrette

Heat oven to 400F. Line a large, rimmed baking sheet with foil, and spray with cooking spray.

In a large bowl combine sweet potatoes, sausage, and grapes; mix well with your hands. Pour about half of the balsamic vinaigrette over the mixture, adding more vinaigrette if necessary, and continue tossing with your hands until everything is coated.

Transfer the mixture to the rimmed baking sheet and bake for 30 to 35 minutes. After 15 minutes, stir the mixture so it will caramelize evenly. The dish is done when the potatoes can be easily pierced with a fork.

Fluffy Baked Mashed Potatoes

2 lbs Yukon gold potatoes (about 5 medium sized), peeled and cut into 1 & ½ inch pieces

1 cup whole milk, at room temperature

4 oz cream cheese, at room temperature 8 Tbsp (1 stick) butter, at room temperature and cut into pieces Salt & pepper 3 large eggs, lightly beaten

Heat oven to 400F. Fill a large pot with the potatoes and 1 inch of water. Bring to a simmer, cover and steam the potatoes until very tender, about 20 to 25 minutes. Drain the potatoes when done and return to the pot.

Add the milk, cream cheese, butter, 2 teaspoons of salt and ½ teaspoon of pepper to the potatoes and mash until smooth. Fold in the eggs. Transfer the mixture to a greased 8x8 inch (or 2-quart) baking dish.

Bake until set and golden brown on the top, about 25 to 30 minutes (or for about 40 minutes if you've prepared these ahead of time and are putting them in the oven cold). *MP Christakos*
